Running concurrently with "Die Traumdeutung 75,35m AMSL" at London's Freud Museum, Miroslaw Balka's latest exhibition explores gravity and the weight of the body, literally and metaphorically. Through sculpture and installation, the Polish artist investigates issues surrounding surface and depth, both mental and physical, and even historical "pollution" scars on the landscape and the collective reaction they evoke. Pierre Soulages
