Carol Rama, 'Spazio anche più che tempo' (Space even more than time) <u>Palazzo Ca' nova</u>

8 May – 28 June 2017

'Space even more than time' marks <u>Carol Rama</u>'s return to Venice after a decade's absence, and coincides with her expansive retrospective at the New Museum in New York. But the late Turin-born artist is no stranger to The Floating City: she participated in four editions of the Biennale and won the Golden Lion for Lifetime Achievement in 2003.

Private View: 9 May, 5.30-7.30pm


<u>Chris Ofili</u>'s 'Poolside Magic', an exhibition of pastel, charcoal and watercolour works on paper, is the inaugural show at Victoria Miro's new Venice gallery space, housed in the former Galleria il Capricorno on San Marco square. It coincides with the Manchester-born artist's current and lauded show, 'Weaving Magic', at the National Gallery, London.

Douglas Gordon, 'Gente di Palermo!' (Citizens of Palermo!)

Palazzo Ducale

13 May – 24 November 2017

Palazzo Ducale is presenting the world premiere of <u>Douglas Gordon</u>'s video installation *Gente di Palermo!* (Citizens of Palermo!), which includes a reassembled home movie he shot in the Cupuchin Catacombs in Palermo, an underground cemetery which houses thousands of exposed, embalmed corpses.

Hieronymus Bosch and Venice

Palazzo Ducale

18 February – 4 June, 2017

'Hieronymus Bosch and Venice' features three newly restored Bosch paintings held in the Gallerie dell'Accademia, which have been returned to their former glory thanks to a campaign fronted by the Bosch Research and Conservation Project (BRCP) and the Getty Foundation of Los Angeles: The martyrdom of Saint Uncumber, Three hermit saints and Paradise and Hell (Visions of the Afterworld).

Giovanni Anselmo

Fondazione Querini Stampalia

9 May – 14 September 2017



Born in 1934, the famed Arte Povera artist Giovanni Anselmo has created a show in six parts: four individual environmental works are met by a fifth operatic element, all of which is completed by a sixth: the viewer.

For the sixth and final show to be curated by Axel Vervoordt at the Palazzo Fortuny with the venue's director Daniela Ferretti, expect the usual fascinating jumbling of old and new, drawing together Klee and Kandinsky with Surrealists such as Breton and Masson, as well as a host of contemporary artists who have created site-specific installations responding to the Fortuny's unique

collection.

Damien Hirst, 'Treasures from the Wreck of the Unbelievable'

Punta della Dogana / Palazzo Grassi

9 April – 3 December 2017

Ten years in the making, this is the first <u>Damien Hirst</u> exhibition in Italy since the British artist's 2004 retrospective at the Museo Archeologico Nazionale in Naples. Titled 'Treasures from the Wreck of the Unbelievable', it is also the first solo exhibition to be displayed across the 5,000 square meters of the Palzzo Grassi and Punta della Dogana – the two Venetian venues of the Pinault Collection – and has reportedly cost between GBP£50 million and 100 million.
